

This sentiment, delivered 100 years ago on the occasion of the Montclair Art Museum's opening ceremonies, reminds me that, in fundamental ways, for all the positive changes that have taken place at the Museum over the past century, MAM still rests on its original, unwavering commitment to the indispensability of art and beauty in our lives.

That such a significant museum was founded in the small town of Montclair was no accident. One of our founders, William T. Evans, a businessman who had amassed the largest collection of American art before World War I, moved to Montclair because he saw it as a vital arts community. This community included George Inness (1825–1894), regarded by his contemporaries as America's greatest landscape painter, who spent the last nine years of his life in Montclair and drew inspiration from the local landscape. Evans, in fact, purchased the Montclair estate of Inness as his family home.

MAM's American collection started with a gift of 36 paintings from Evans, who in turn challenged other Montclair residents to raise funds for the building. Florence Rand Lang answered his call, pledging funds toward the building, as well as her mother's extensive collection of Native American art.

We are all the beneficiaries of some truly great leaders whose vision and generosity enabled us to celebrate so joyfully this year. We are stewards of a priceless jewel—an art museum of profound importance to its community. For a century the Museum has served as a cultural magnet for northern New Jersey, and now Montclair is a town widely viewed as uniquely dedicated to arts and culture.

But our celebrations this year have been as much about our future as our past, and as you'll see in the report, they have laid the groundwork for continuing and expanding the Museum's ability to support art and art education in our region.

I thank the trustees, staff, volunteers, artists, teachers, foundations, corporations, and private donors who have variously contributed time, imagination, art, and financial support to MAM. We can all look forward to our second century with confidence, knowing that we are playing our part in sustaining this remarkable heritage.

MONTCLAIR MEANS ART!

FROM THE DIRECTOR



ne hundred years ago, in 1914, the Montclair Art Museum opened its doors to the public for the first time. To mark this milestone in MAM's history, we celebrated throughout the fiscal year with a series of extraordinary events long in the planning.

Our exhibitions highlighted the Museum's collection and focused on New Jersey, leading off with *Looking* Forward: Gifts from the Patricia A. Bell Collection, a selection of the more than 40 works of contemporary art that former Trustee and MAM dear friend Patricia Bell has donated to the Museum over the past 10 years. Patricia began collecting art in 1989 and has observed: "When an artwork comes into my home, I feel as though I've made a connection to the soul of the artist. ... There are lots of different ways to tell history, but art is one of the most interesting ways of keeping track of what's going on." We are deeply grateful to Pat for sharing artworks with MAM that hold such personal meaning for her.

The exhibition 100 Works for 100 Years: A Centennial Celebration showcased MAM's permanent collection with works reflecting its rich cultural history. Installed in phases throughout Fall 2013, the exhibition also included rare archival documents, which play such a central role in telling the Museum's story. We thank longtime docent Judith Hinds for lending her considerable expertise to this project.

New Jersey itself was represented by one adopted and one native son:

the Teaneck, New Jersey-based conceptual artist **Robert Barry** (b. 1936) and the Passaic-born **Robert Smithson** (1938–1973), for whose art the New Jersey landscape played a critical role, as this exhibition convincingly demonstrated.

Our educational activities—public and family programs, school tours, community exhibitions, and art school classes—attracted large numbers, as you can see in the report, contributing substantially to our more than 64,000 onsite visitors to the Museum. Highlights include a new Creative Aging Program and a drastically expanded partnership with Newark Public Schools. Additionally, near the end of the fiscal year, the Museum launched the MAM Art Truck, a mobile open studio, housed in a retrofitted ice cream truck, that offers free art projects and lessons to MAM's community. The truck has already been greeted with great and enthusiastic acclaim—you will surely be hearing more about that in next year's report.

Free First Thursday Nights—which offers free admission, dynamic programming, live music, tours, and a full-service bar—continued into its second year, even surpassing the high standard it set in its launch year. It attracted more than 6,000 people over eight evenings, an average of 750 a night! Free First Thursdays is also bringing in new audiences, with 35% of attendees reporting that they had never been to MAM before.

MAM led up to its **Birthday Party** on January 15, 2014, with a **100 Day Countdown**, beginning October 7. The MAM website featured a special section with daily art projects, MAM facts, Museum events, and more. Montclair businesses, in partnership with MAM, offered discounts, coupons, and special events at Montclair restaurants and boutiques, all of which raised visibility and incited expectations for the Centennial Year. And what a Birthday Party it was, attracting over 2,000 guests,

a fittingly historic number! That evening also marked the unveiling of a major art commission. *Yellow*, by **Spencer Finch**, consists of four large-scale compositions, printed on transparencies and displayed on light boxes mounted in four ground-floor windows on the Museum's façade. Emitting a gentle incandescent light, this installation permanently celebrates MAM's intimate character.

Crucial to the fiscal health of the Museum are funds raised by special events, and this year our Board and Staff seized the Centennial Year as an opportunity to raise muchneeded funds. Five very special events celebrated 100 years of art and innovation: **Fright Night at the Museum**, a Halloween-themed fundraiser, which kicked off the

Centennial celebrations; **Decades:** A Century of Fashion, a sold-out event featuring preeminent fashion historian, author, and TV personality Cameron Silver; the Centennial Ball, where over 300 guests honored MAM past presidents as well as founders William T. Evans and Florence Rand Lang, as well as those individuals and leaders who helped to transform the Museum galleries; the **Fashionably** Late Dance Party, which directly followed the Centennial Ball; and the Centennial Toast & Taste, offering an exciting twist on MAM's annual Wine Bar. I thank the chairs and cochairs of the committees that made these events possible, all of whom are recognized in the report.

I thank as well our engaged and hardworking Board and Staff, our dedicated volunteers, our many community partners, and all our supporters, who give so generously to MAM throughout each year. You have helped to make our Centennial Year a rousing success!



- MAM serves New Jersey's diverse general population through programs and exhibitions. Within NJ, as determined from our Membership records, MAM reaches constituents from 15 counties, including Bergen, Burlington, Essex, Hudson, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, Union, and Warren. More than 138 schools, community organizations, universities, museums, senior centers and artist colonies, representing over 46 communities and 3 states (NJ, NY, VA) as well as international student groups from Korea participated in guided tours of the Museum's Permanent Collections and special exhibitions. Museum members include constituents from 9 different states.

FY 14 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In FY14, all exhibitions, as well as a wealth of programs and events, showcased the Museum's heritage and examined and celebrated its role in the community.

- This year MAM launched an Art Truck, a mobile open studio, housed in a retrofitted ice cream truck, that offers free art projects and lessons to MAM's community. It seeks to raise visibility for the Museum and its Yard School of Art in surrounding towns while feeding creativity in underserved communities and audiences.
- MAM began a Creative Aging program focusing on 3 initiatives for seniors in an effort to increase service with customized programs and access to the Museum's arts activities for this community. The initiatives include Art in the Afternoon, a monthly program including both art-viewing and art-making; Artful Outing, a monthly program offered to individuals with dementia and their care partners; and Bridges, an intergenerational arts partnership.
- In our Yard School of Art, over 2,433 students of all ages took one or more of 234 classes and 43 workshops. The Yard School's Ceramics Studio remains the only resource of its kind at a Museum in NJ, and our Digital Media Lab has proven to be highly successful at attracting new students. The Yard School of Art also acquired a Charles Brand etching press, which significantly expanded printmaking offerings in our studio facility.
- During the 2013-14 school year, MAM drastically expanded the scope of our work with Newark Public Schools (NPS). MAM has been invited to act as the museum partner during the last year of the Newark Arts Integrating Literacy (NAIL) project, a Newark Public School initiative funded by a major, multi-year grant from the US Department of Education. In addition to delivering professional development workshops at the Museum for 30 classroom and art teachers from 5 Newark elementary schools, MAM has also developed model lessons that link talking about and making art to elementary-level literacy.
- MAM's second year of Free First Thursdays, a new initiative which MAM offers late hours from 5 to






9 p.m. the first Thursday of the month (October–June), with free admission, dynamic programming, live music, tours, and a full service bar. Free First Thursdays has proven very successful in attracting new visitors, with 35% of attendees reporting that they had never been to MAM before. These 8 evenings brought in a total of over 6,000 people, averaging over 750 per night.

- Over 409 guided tours took place this year, with over 20% of school tours reaching underserved communities.
- MAM is proud to be a family-friendly institution. Park Bench, Free Family Days, Home School Days, and SummerART are just a few of MAM's programs that continue to provide excellent art opportunities to the youngest members of our community.
- The Scholastics Art Awards attracted 4,500

- submissions, triple the 1,500 submissions MAM received when we began this national partnership in 2009. We are thrilled to announce that twelve students from our region received awards at the national level.
- The crowd-sourced audio guide for the exhibition 100 Work for 100 Years: A Centennial Celebration titled 100 Years, 100 Voices involved 50+ community members including artists, historians, high school students, and nursing home residents contributing to more than 60 audio segments.
- MAM was named NJ Monthly's Favorite Museum,
 North and listed among the top Museums in Morris
 and Essex by Morris/Essex Health & Life readers.
 The Yard School of Art was also awarded an
 Honorable Mention for the Most Write-In votes in
 the Discover Jersey Arts People's Choice Awards.



CENTENNIAL YEAR PRESS

The Montclair Art Museum received extraordinary press coverage during its Centennial Year.

The **Montclair Times** was a key media partner for MAM's Centennial. Their coverage included 10 Works for 10 Decades (a photo highlight of an artwork from 100 Works for 100 Years every week for 10 weeks), a two-page cover article by Kelly Ebbels (December 19), and pre- and post-event coverage for the Birthday Party, the Decades Luncheon, and the Centennial Ball & Fashionably Late Dance Party. All of MAM's Centennial Year exhibitions were also reviewed by The Montclair Times, and public and family programs are regularly featured in calendar listings as well as feature articles. **Baristanet** also marked MAM's Centennial with a dedicated section of their website, highlighting all recent articles on the Museum, as well as a MAM ad.

The **Robert Smithson's New Jersey** exhibition garnered extensive press including in long lead magazines such as **Studio International** and **Sculpture** magazine, newspapers including **The New York Times** and **NY Observer**, and local media.

All Centennial events were covered widely, especially the Birthday Party, Decades Luncheon, and Centennial Ball/Fashionably Late Dance Party. For Fright Night, the Decades Luncheon, the Centennial Ball/Fashionably Late Dance Party, and the Centennial Toast & Taste, MAM Communications coordinated efforts with the special events firm The Hip Event.

MAM'S 100TH BIRTHDAY PARTY

The 100 Day Countdown generated awareness and interest in MAM's Centennial by marking the 100 days prior to our 100th Birthday Party on January 15. The countdown took the form of an interactive website with dynamic daily content in honor of the Centennial. Every day, the website included a creative at-home art project developed by instructors in the Yard School of Art and MAM educators, a fun fact pulled from MAM's

archives celebrating MAM's history, and a reason to join or support MAM. Over 25 community partners offered specials in honor of MAM during the countdown including MAM-related events, items, deals, and offers that could be accessed with a pass available at MAM and participating partners, (pictured at right).

Over 2,000 guests helped to celebrate MAM's **100th Birthday** at a free evening event on January 15, 2014 exactly 100 years to the day from the Museum's founding! The party included an opening reception for *100 Works* for *100 Years, Spencer Finch: Yellow*, and Respond: *Poet-in-Residence*

Project and performances by the Newark Boys Chorus, WFUV DJs Rita Houston and Russ Borris, and students from Montclair State University's John J. Cali School of Music. We celebrated MAM's birthday with a signature cake from MAM's Honorary Guest The Cake Boss, Buddy Valastro and watched the premiere of the Centennial Film directed by Dawn Porter and produced by Mark Urman. Visitors were encouraged to express their own creativity through creating birthday hats or drawing from a model in workshops run by the Yard School of Art. Guests also enjoyed additional light refreshments and a cash bar, including beer provided by NJ Beer Company and Flying Fish Brewery and food trucks from Hunger Construction and Thai Elephant!

SPECIAL EVENTS

MAM's Centennial Celebration began in Fiscal Year 2014 led by Centennial Celebration Co-Chairs Lisa Amato and Lyn Reiter. With a committee of over 100 dedicated volunteers, five very special events were able to take place at the Museum, celebrating 100 years of art and innovation.

Kicking off MAM's Centennial Celebration was **Fright Night at the Museum**, a Halloween-themed fundraiser on October 19, 2013. Event Co-Chairs Lynn & Stephen Glasser and Tracy Higgins & Jim Leitner helped transform the Museum for a haunting evening of brews and potions, a wicked buffet feast, and boneshaking dancing. The "Chamber of Gilt" was filled with silent auction treasures and guests were treated to a flash mob performance of "Thriller" by dancers from Montclair High School's Advanced Dance Program. Philanthropist and collector Patricia A. Bell was honored at the event.

Preeminent fashion historian, author, and TV personality Cameron Silver joined guests and Centennial Luncheon Co-Chairs Mary Dana and Claudia Placentra at **Decades: A Century of Fashion** on April 9, 2014. This sold-out event featured a basket raffle, trunk show curated by Silver specifically for event attendees, luncheon, and lecture.
