You'll also find the latest information on the 2016 Annual Convention and the registration form. This important event takes place this November and we hope to see as many members as possible in Texas.






A Note to The Journal...

The following was sent to the Journal from a concerned member regarding the last issue: "I have been enjoying the Journal very much since you became editor and look forward to receiving each issue, however, one section is a bit of a disappointment and concern for me as a long-time owner and exhibitor of Modern Shetlands and Modern Pleasure Shetlands. I am referring to Q & A where a very brief description of the Modern Pleasure Shetland was given. In particular, where the Modern Pleasure is only described as 'animated trot and heavy shoes'." The letter also stated two other concerns - disappointment that a judge might have provided this information and that those who show Moderns and Modern Pleasures already have to educate the public that their ponies don't get shod like Tennessee Walking Horses or treated like the Walkers to get them to trot that way. As described in the rulebook - Modern Pleasures are to be shown barefoot or with an evenly weighted shoe of uniform thickness and optional light pad. It was also noted that more description would have been appreciated.

The Journal would like to apologize for the choice of words used to describe these classes (they not provided by a judge). Our next issue will have an article expanding upon Modern/Modern Pleasure in greater length by an experienced judge and trainer which I think will be beneficial to our subscribers. Thank you for your input and as always, we will strive to provide informative and interesting articles that show our ponies/horses in their most favorable light.

NOTE: Judges Clinics are open to all members whether they intend on becoming a judge or simply would like to be more educated on judging procedures. Advance registration is required.


Apprentice steward Diane Bingenheimer Teague had a one-of –a-kind pony to

Halloween Spooktacular show on October 28, 29, 30 in Glen Rose Texas!







you think the youth program helps them to achieve their career path (that may or may not be equine related).



Health Industry Update

Treatment of Bacterial Diseases

By John Hallberg, DVM

Resistant Bacteria Concern

Use of antimicrobial drugs in animals or people will generate resistant bacteria. Increased incidence of resistant bacteria causes concern to both veterinarians and physicians. As bacteria become more resistant to more antibacterial compounds, treatment of disease caused by these bacteria becomes more difficult due to reduced number of effective drugs. There are multiple sources of resistant organisms including those resistant bacteria generated by use of antibacterial drugs in people or from antibiotic use in animals. Resistant bacteria can be created with improper use of antibiotics such as use of the wrong drug for an infectious disease, use of an ineffective dose or failure to complete a complete dose regime just to name a few.

Combating Antibiotic Resistance - U.S. Gov't

Concern for increased resistance has gained recognition by the US government. In September of 2014, the Council of Advisors on Science and Technology issued a report to the President on Combating Antibiotic Resistance and this was followed with a National Strategy for Combating Antibiotic Resistant Bacteria. Further information on actions of the federal government can

This action plan seeks to slow the development and spread of resistant pathogens, increase surveillance for resistant pathogens, increase development of rapid diagnostic tests, increase the development of new products to combat infectious disease and improve international collaboration on this issue.

CVM & FDA Guidance

Prior to this report, the Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM) at the US Food and Drug Administration issued Guidance for Industry(GFI) 209 that outlined CVM's view on the prudent and judicious use of antibacterial drugs in food producing animals. CVM stated that the use of medically important antibacterial drugs in medicated feeds given to food producing animals for the treatment,

control and prevention of disease was a prudent and judicious use. CVM defines medically important antibacterial drugs by their importance for use in people not in animals. CVM also stated that the use of these same antibacterial

drugs in feed for growth promotion (production claims) was not a judicious use. Finally, CVM stated that it was essential for veterinarians to be fully in charge in the decision to use antibacterial drugs in animals.

Subsequently, CVM issued GFI 213 that outlines the timelines and activities pharmaceutic sponsors are currently following to remove all production claims from medicated feeds containing medically important antibacterial drugs and to put all these compounds under the full control of a veterinarian via Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD). All the pharmaceutical companies have all voluntarily agreed to remove these production claims from medicated feeds containing medically important antibiotics and they will complete this activity by December of 2016. CVM has also completed revision of the VFD regulation to allow full implement these new VFD requirements.

In addition to the changes to medicated feeds, all medically important antibiotics found in water soluble powders that are used to treat livestock in their drinking water will move to prescription (Rx) status meaning they will require a veterinary script prior to purchase and use. It should also be noted that most currently available injectable antibiotic products are only available as veterinary Rx products. 
Currently, there are a few old products such as injectable procaine penicillin G that are still available over the counter and without a veterinary script but in the future, CVM has indicated that even these products will be changed to Rx status and will only be available via veterinary script.


These regulatory changes in antibiotic use will have

the greatest effect on all antibacterial drugs used in food producing animals. This new regulation will have little effect on the use of antibacterial drugs in ponies and horses. Currently, the only FDA approved products

in horses are applied via injection or as an oral powder/pill. There are no FDA approved antibiotics for use in horse feed.

As previously indicated, use of any antibacterial drug has the ability to generate resistant bacteria. To minimize the emergence of resistant bacteria, it is essential for all pony and horse owners to consult their veterinarian prior to treating any infectious disease. Your veterinarian's experience in the diagnosis and treatment of infectious disease will ensure that you are using an appropriate drug with instructions for properly administering this product to your horse and pony. Antibiotics are valuable tools in both veterinary and human medicine. Prudent and judicious use of all antibiotic drugs in animals and people will help maintain effectiveness of these tools for the future.

Q & A Post Foaling/Breeding

The Journal asked veterinarian & breeder Matt Taylor, and breeders Janice Silvio of Amoré Miniatures, Pam & Robert Walsh of Rocking Horse Acres, and John & Cindy Cherry of Cherryville Farms a few post-foaling/breeding questions. and they were kind enough to provide some info. Please keep in mind that the breeders responses come from experience and are a personal preference/opinion - they are not veterinarians nor claim to be the ultimate authority on the subject.

MT: Matt Taylor, DVM AM: Amoré Miniatures CF: Cherryville Farms RHA: Rocking Horse Acres

How do you check to see if the mare and foal are okay?

MT: I start by watching from a distance. Look to see if the foal is nursing vigorously, walking handily, urinating and deficating normally. Watch the mare to see if she is mothering, has adequate milk (2 pulls from each side is enough), cleaned, and is comfortable. After all of that then I get up close and check the heart and lungs of the foal.

It's navel for discharge or a hernia. It's mouth for a good bite and septal defects. I check the mare's color and heart rate to see if her cardiovascular status is good. I check her vagina for tears.

AM: Our mares & foals are monitored and stalled nightly with daily turn out, so they are observed though out the

day and our monitor system is on over night, our horses are closely watched.

CF:We have cameras in the barn and a monitor in the house so we can watch them. We also make several trips to the barn in the first few hours after birth.

What is expected of the new foal and mare?

MT: Vigorous affection and a joy for life.

AM: Absolutely nothing but to eat, grow & enjoy their time together. Although we do start imprinting foals from the start of their life and their expectations are to learn to walk on lead, eventually standing tied, learning to be groomed

and handled. This is kept within small sessions and not over done as we do not over familiarize them.

CF: Immediately upon foaling, the mare should bite on the sac, opening it for the baby. In addition, she should start licking the foal to clean its airways and then

continue to clean the body. We expect the baby to stand in the first 30 minutes or so and to start trying to nurse shortly after standing. The mare is expected to tolerate the foal trying to nurse and to nuzzle and nip at the rear of the foal to coerce it to nurse.

Are you breeding the mare back? When should you do that?

MT: Most mares will cycle between day 8-13 after foaling.

AM: In most cases, we wait until the heat cycle after their foal heat - which is usually 10 days after foal's birth. We tend to wait on that cycle so that the mare has good healing and is in a more relaxed state and her nervousness about her foal has subsided.

CF: If the mare is one that I have had for a while and I know she maintains her weight and health after foaling, I will breed her back. Usually, I will not breed her back until she is in her 2nd or 3rd heat after foaling depending on her overall condition.

What are important aspects of weaning of the foal?

MT: Keep mare and foal out of sight of each other. Pay attention to the foal's appetite and water intake. Deworming the foal monthly.

AM: We usually start our weaning in a very thoughtful way, normally if the foal is mature mentally & physically at age 3 1/2 - 4 months I start with giving their vaccines, while on mom, I first start with their 6 way vaccine, and then in a week I do their other vaccines, if everything seemed to be fine with this, I then move into our weaning process. We are lucky enough to have stalls for all horses, I have a section of stalls that are smaller for foals and close together so they can touch each other, and the mother stalls are around these stalls but across the aisle way, so on the first

night I decide to wean, the babies will be in the stalls across from momma, and of course there are night lights on so they do not get scared.

The next morning they are allowed to return to their mom and to be with them all day. Again at night I separate them again and they go back the next morning. I do this for three - four days and as long as each foal is maintaining and dealing well with everything, on the fourth day they do not go back with their mom in the morning, but mom is in field across and always have visual connection with them, they just can not nurse anymore. Also during this process I decrease mare's grain, giving a handful until they dry up about a week.

CF: Before even thinking of weaning the foal, I make sure it is already nibbling on hay and is eating grain right along with its mother. It is my practice to try and leave the baby with the mare until it is at least 4 to 6 months old. I feel you end up with a much stronger horse in the long run by giving it extra time.

RHA: I generally wean at six months, unless there is a reason to wean earlier. If the mare or foal has been sold, I would wean as early as three-four months if needed for transport reasons - providing the foal is strong and healthy. If a mare is having difficulty keeping good weight while nursing the foal, I may also decide to wean her foal before six months.

If the baby is not healthy or does not survive, do you breed back to the same cross?

MT: I blame that mostly on the mare, I'll give her a 2nd chance, but sick foals are expensive and dead foals are worthless. Mares must get the job done, but some mares will do better on some farms than others. A mare that fails for me may succeed for you and that's ok.

AM: Very blessed to not have had these issues, however if we did it would be a discussion with our vet and all circumstances reviewed, if it was just a freak happening, we very well might retry once more, but be very closely monitoring the gestation.

CF: That would depend entirely on the type of health issues it has. If I felt it was a genetic abnormality, I would never breed back to the same cross.

RHA: Unless there is a genetic issue that has caused the foal to be unhealthy, I would repeat the cross.

Do you breed by bloodlines or by stallion and mare attributes?

MT: Both. Good mares give consistently good foals that different stallions will change. Consistency is more valuable than a good foal every once in awhile.

AM: Breed by both, we have tried our best to bring the best conformed mares to our stallions, Both of our stallions

have superior conformation, although we do like to bring some of the best lines together.

CF: I breed by both. However, most importantly to me is to make sure both are quality. Neither the mare nor the stallion can do it all.

RHA: I breed by stallion and mare attributes more strongly than by bloodlines, but bloodlines do also have an influence on breeding decisions.

Do you camera your horses during foaling or let them naturally have the foals without intervention?

MT: I expect my mares to do the job on their own. I check them 2x daily, but a mare that requires 24/7 observation is just too costly for me to be successful with.

AM: Our horses are stalled and turned out daily, during foaling season they are closely monitored with camera's breeding dates, milk testing. I personally assist each of my mares as this is what we do, I deliver each foal, dry them & blanket

the foal as they have a difficult time the first couple days regulating their body temperatures, and with us in the northern states weather plays a factor in their safety, I then clean the stall and rebed with fresh bedding & straw, as the foal begins to stand and fumble around to nurse I help them find the breakfast bar. After they nurse I do give an enema as I hate to see foals strain to eliminate. As something new this season, we have been giving some IGG serum from the

vet, which is costly, however we found the foals were strong and full of themselves with this advantage.

CF: We used to watch them around the clock on cameras but have found that they do much better when left alone. However, we do watch mares with a history of previous problems or first-time mares.






Where do you see your breeding going through your program?

MT: As a breeder you can't try and follow a trend. By the time you catch up the trend will change again. Make your own trend. Breed ponies you like and hopefully others will too.

AM: We have been in the industry for quite some time and at this point I see our program starting to decrease,

although we normally only have 4-5 foals a year, we very well may continue with that number but overall we are decreasing.

CF: In the world of the American Shetlands, we feel that the Foundation Certified horses are having a strong increase in popularity. We feel the pres-

ence of more substance, carriage and beauty are the factors causing the rise in popularity In the Miniature horses, the continued refinement and elegance of these horses is improving every year. People are attracted to beauty and style and these horses are showing more of it every day in the show ring and breeding programs across the nation.

If the cross didn't create what you thought it would, do you try again hoping the DNA matches better the second time?

MT: No. That's far too slow. I cross a stud on multiple related mares (sisters, daughters). If I get 4/5 to have quality foals then I'll do it again knowing the 5th mare will likely have a better foal the next time while 1 of the 4 will probably have a poorer one.

AM: Our horses are stalled and turned out depending on the situation, if there was minimal reason to not like the cross, we very well may try again. However if the cross was a definite bad cross - we absolutely would not repeat the cross. We are very conscientious of producing foals and would not produce to produce, we take this very seriously and love each and every foal that is born to our stallions.

CF:Not usually as there are some crosses that just don't work. The biggest mistake that people make is expecting their exquisite stallion to produce world champions with average or below average mares. That is one of the reasons why we have accumulated so many successful older mares that have a track record of producing excellence and National Champions.

RHA: Determining whether or not to repeat the cross is much more complex than focusing on just the current foal. To determine appropriate crosses, you first have to be sure that you can objectively critique your own horses. If you cannot objectively consider each horses' strengths and weaknesses, you cannot choose the best crosses to improve the breed with your foals.

You don't breed a mare and stallion together that both need improvement

in the same area and hope for a foal that will be better than both parents. While I won't say this doesn't happen, it is very uncommon. I do believe it happens only in the tiniest fraction of pairings and then I personally don't believe the resulting horse will breed true to his own attributes. He will be more likely to pass on the traits of his parents, which are what he reasonably should have inherited in the first place. The flip side is that, on rare occasions, you also may get a foal that may not quite measure up to his parents and therefore could possibly sire better foals than expected since his grandparents' attributes may have more of an impact

My personal opinion when breeding is that you get what you deserve. If your foal is not up to par, you need to take a hard look at the sire and dam and figure out where the flaws came from that you are seeing in your foal. Almost always, you will see it in one or both parents. There are of course some traits that will come from grandparents or further back, but I have found that generally, the only time you get "throw backs" to negative traits from the grandparents is when you are using a stallion or mare that actually ended up being a better horse than it should have been based on the sire and dam. An example of this would be if two ugly headed horses were bred together and they produced the most gorgeous, dished head you've ever seen on a foal. That foal becomes a breeding stallion and still has that gorgeous Arabian head. Then when his foals arrive, you see the head of the foal's grandparents rather than the sire passing on his head

that he really shouldn't have had in the first place, based on his breeding. If I've done my homework prior to breeding the mare and stallion and I am not happy with the foal, most likely I did not do a good job initially and need to review my choice. There could also be that slim chance that I didn't get the foal I deserved from the cross and therefore I should try again...but, in my opinion, that's probably less than a 1% possibility.



Two classes that are available to carriage drivers that sometimes are not used as they seem to be difficult to set up or to perform. That is really not the case. With a little practice at home, you can learn the Precision Driving pattern and techniques.

Obstacle Driving

Carriage Obstacle Driving is a timed cones obstacle course that is fun, a crowd pleaser and our equines really love it. Drivers navigate their horse and carriage through the course, usually at a trot, with the fastest time and clean round as their goal. Penalty seconds are added for balls dislodged and errors.


Preparation and training for driving cones is best done through good dressage training. Learning to bend properly and stay in balance will allow your horse to navigate a cones course with ease. Practicing with a couple of sets of cones will teach you how to approach the obstacles and navigate without knocking the balls off. It's not intended to be trick class with severe turns, but a test of consistency, balance and precision with speed added in for fun and competition. The course pattern will indicate the obstacle numbers and direction to pass through. Otherwise, when navigating a cones course, it is the driver's responsibility to determine how to complete the course, each pair of cones in numerical order, in the most efficient manner and without knocking balls down. The shortest route is not always the fastest route. If you have to slow down or stop to make a turn, you are losing time.

The cones can be set in a wide variety of patterns with turns and changes of direction. Please refer to the rule book for specifics on distances and components. Ideas for patterns can be found online and collected from other events. When you go to CDEs, save the patterns and pass them on to the show organizers to keep on file. As long as the competitors don't know which pattern will be used in advance of the posting at the show, there should not be a conflict. When setting up courses, a good rule of thumb is that if a show official in a golf cart can drive through the course, it should be negotiable with

a horse and carriage. Competitors should not drive the course in a vehicle, prior to competing. Like other obstacle courses, they may do a course walk, without their horse. We carriage drivers can encourage the addition of these classes by offering to help with set up, or send your fellow competitors in to help while you help them with classes that you are not showing in. A couple of volunteer ball setters are nice to have on hand during the class, in the event that balls need to be reset. Yes, setting up another course is work for our show staff and we thank you for making the effort for us.

Cones Course



From the Rulebook:

Section XII - In Hand/Single Working Rules

1.10 Classic/AMHR Carriage Obstacle Driving

A. To be driven over a prescribed course of numbered obstacles (traffic cones with balls to similar objects placed on top). The numbers are to be placed on the right side of the obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimension of the driver area, not to exceed 20 obstacles.

- B. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line.
- C. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.
- D. Suggested width for obstacles are 10 inches wider than the carriage from outside hub to outside hub. Should cones be set up and carriages not be measured, obstacle widths are to be set:
- 1. For ASPC 66 inches (5 feet 6 inches) apart.
- 2. For AMHR- 60 inches (5 feet) apart.
- E. The decision to allow cantering for this class is left to the discretion of show management. It is not allowed unless clearly stated in the prize list. If cantering is not allowed, breaks in gait on the course will be penalized.

Section XII - In Hand/Single Working Rules

1.9 Precision Driving/Classic Carriage Precision Driving (ASPC/AMHR)

A. General:

The purpose of this competition is to test the skill of the driver and the obedience and handiness of the animal. Martingales and overchecks are prohibited for all vehicles. Side checks are optional. Failure to comply will incur elimination. Entries are required to drive over a course consisting of at least six to a maximum of eight obstacles. The track of the course will be irregular, necessitating changes of direction. Markers indicating obstacles must be at least 12" wider than the outside hub of the wheels of each vehicle. To be judged 80% on the fault system and 20% on manners and performance.

B. Faults:

Displacing markers	1 fault
Each hoof outside marker	1 fault
Wheel outside marker	1 fault
Canter, each time	1 fault

C. Elimination:

- 1. Failing to pass through the Start & Finish Markers
- 2. Receiving outside assistance
- 3. Taking any obstacle out of order (off course)
- 4. Showing an obstacle to the horse

D. Course:

- 1. Enter at a trot.
- 2. Through two pair of cones.
- 3. Trot a figure eight.
- 4. Trot a serpentine of five cones.
- 5. Walk with right wheel(s) between poles.
- 6. Walk to four cones and back into square, stop for 10 seconds,
- 7. Trot with left wheel(s) between poles and exit.




Precision Driving

Precision Driving tests the skill of the driver and obedience and handiness of the horse or pony. This is not a speed event. As the title indicates, precision is the goal. Figure of eight should be two mirrored circles with a precise centerline. Serpentines should be uniform loops and changes of pace should be spot on in their timing and location as indicated on the pattern.

The most common question I receive is, "How do I back into the box (#6)?" Well, there is no set way to accomplish it. But, I have learned from some experienced carriage drivers the skills to navigate this obstacle. It does take practice at home to learn where to position your carriage. One method is similar to the draft horse swing, or docking procedure. If in a cart, position your left wheel just before the far cone and pivot, swinging the horse to the right 90 degrees. You should be able to line up straight and then back into the box. Another way is to pass the far cone, then back your horse around the corner and into

the box. This method is difficult to get the cart in the narrow box without running over the cones. So, teaching the pivot/docking maneuver will benefit you greatly with this obstacle.



There you go! Two more classes to practice for and encourage your show management to offer them. Good Luck and enjoy the drive!





This August marks the Summer Olympics in Rio. Equestrian events with competition from around the globa will compete. This August marks the the globe will compete for the Gold.

The Rio 2016 entries are all in, and a total of 200 horse and rider combinations from 43 countries will compete for Gold in three separate disciplines: dressage, eventing, and jumping.

"Since 2007 there has been an 83% increase in the number of international competitions, and young people are being drawn into equestrian sport in greater numbers than ever before" said Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) Secretary General Sabrina Ibáñez. "Our sport really appeals to the youth culture. The Brazilian Dressage team is a good example, with all four members below the age of 25, and one of them holding the distinction of being the youngest equestrian athlete at these games."

"We have a really wide age-range in our fan-base due to the nature of our sport and we expect a huge following during the Rio 2016 Olympic Games," Ibáñez said.

Olympic Equestrian Facts and Figures

- Equestrian sport has been part of the Olympic Games since 1912.
- Team and individual medals are awarded in three disciplines: dressage, eventing, and jumping.
- Team USA holds the record for the greatest level of participation, with 236 horse and rider combinations competing throughout the history of the games.
- Team Germany has won the most medals, collecting 75 to date.
- The equestrian events of the Rio 2016 Olympic Games will be staged in the Deodoro Olympic Park alongside basketball, BMX, canoe slalom, fencing, hockey, modern pentathlon, mountain biking, rugby sevens, and shooting.
- The Deodoro Olympic Park is the second largest Olympic cluster of the Rio 2016 Games venues.
- Jumping: 27 countries, 15 teams, 75 horse/rider combinations
- Eventing: 24 countries, 13 teams, 65 horse/rider combinations
- Dressage: 25 countries, 11 teams, 60 horse/rider combinations
- The Rio 2016 sport entries also include 34 reserve horses and 33 reserve riders.
- The countries represented are: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Chinese Taipei, Colombia, Denmark, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, Finland, France, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Morocco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Palestine, Poland, Peru, Puerto Rico, Qatar, Republic of South Africa, Russia, Spain, Switzerland, Sweden, Turkey, Ukraine, Uruguay, the United States, Venezuela, and Zimbabwe.



Blast from the Past



With it being an election year, here is a blast from the past regarding former First Lady, Jacqueline Kennedy. This excerpt shows the passion she had for horses and how it was shared by her children - even while living in the White House.

In early June 1951, Jackie Bouvier was introduced by friends to John (Jack) Kennedy, a young Congressman from Massachusetts. In November 1952, Jackie and her cousin, John Davis, talked about Jack over lunch in Washington, D.C., where she worked as the Inquiring Camera Girl for the *Washington Times-Herald*. Jackie confided that Jack was allergic to animal hair, expecially horse hair.

"Imagine me with someone allergic to horses!" Jackie exclaimed. Both she and Davis had a good laugh over that.

On September 12, 1953, Jacqueline Lee Bouvier and John Fitzgerald Kennedy, who had been elected to the U.S. Senate the year before, were married at St. Mary's Church in Newport, RI. On November 27, 1957, Jackie gave birth to a daughter, Caroline Bouvier Kennedy. A few weeks after Jack Kennedy was elected President, a son, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Jr., was born on November 25, 1960.

Caroline and John Fr. had a menagerie at the White House. The most famous pet was Caroline's pony, Macaroni, which was given to her by Vice President, Lyndon B. Johnson. Jackie had a stable constructed for Macaroni and Leprechaun, a pony she obtained for John Jr. at Glen-Ora, the Kennedy's 400-acre leased weekend house in the Virginia countryside.

The Secret Service was concerned with Caroline's safety while she was riding Macaroni and suggested the agents follow her on horseback. Jackie objected strongly. She told them that Caroline was a better rider than the Secret Service agents, who had very limited knowledge of horses. Jackie told them that as a child she had broken her collarbone falling off a horse and that an occasional fall would happen.

"I expect Caroline to have her share of riding spills and accidents. How else wills he learn?" Jackie asked.

Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy performed the duties of the First Lady with youthful beauty, elegance, and intelligence. Whenever the opportunities arose, however, she rode at Glen-Ora and later with the Orange County Hunt. Her love of horses and riding became a refuge from the tensions and stress of the White House.

Proposed Legislation

Putting an End to Inhumane Training Methods



July 26, 2016

The USDA is releasing its proposed rules for ending horse soring today, and public commenting will begin. The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service is the agency tasked with enforcing the Horse Protection Act (HPA.) "As tasked by Congress, the HPA's ultimate goal is to completely end the inhumane practice of soring," said APHIS Administrator Kevin Shea. "The recommended changes will ultimately help us end soring altogether by giving USDA direct control over the inspection process, and banning the use of certain equipment and training devices is allowed under existing regulations. We believe an independent pool of APHIS-trained inspectors, combined with a ban on inhumane training methods, will be a more effective deterrent to the cruel and inhumane practice of horse soring."

Among the proposed new rules,

- APHIS would assume responsibility for training, screening and licensing horse inspectors. The new
 cadre of inspectors would be veterinarians and veterinary technicians who would be required to
 follow APHIS rules and standards of conduct.
- APHIS would ban the use of all action devices, pads, and foreign substances at horse shows, exhibitions, sales, and auctions. This would align the HPA regulations with existing equestrian standards set forth by the U.S. Equestrian Federation.

Keith Dane, senior advisor for equine protection with the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) said "While a handful of politicians doing the bidding of sorers have so far blocked passage of the PAST Act, horses are being tortured for competitions and the corrupt industry self-policing has lost all credibility. It's time for all equestrians, animal lovers and humane-minded people across America to say enough is enough and support toughening the regulations."

Swollen or Filled Legs: What is wrong with my horse?

Horses can rapidly develop swelling or "filling" in one or more legs. Is it serious? What causes it?

A common reason for filling is inactivity in a horse that is accustomed to moving around. An example might be a horse that is usually turned out in the pasture but has been kept in a stall overnight, maybe at a show or in preparation for an early ride the next day. The owner notices that the horse's rear legs are puffy and swollen as he's led out of the stall. The legs are not uncommonly warm, and the horse may move somewhat stiffly but is not truly lame. Caused by inactivity and reduced lymph flow, this "stocking up" is usually not serious and will dissipate as the horse is exercised. It's more common in older horses and can affect all four legs, though stocking up is often seen only in the hind legs.

If your horse has leg swelling accompanied by lameness, warmth in the leg or hoof, or an elevated body tempera-

ture, it's time to call the veterinarian. This is more than simple stocking up.

Swelling in a single leg is likely to signal a serious condition. Horses can "blow up" a leg in response to a scratch, cut, or puncture wound that may be so insignificant that it's hard to find. The leg may be warm in addition to being swollen. This swelling isn't likely to go down until the wound is cared for and any infection is treated.

A horse that has significant swelling in all four legs may have some type of systemic illness. This could be a sign of heart trouble, liver or kidney disease, or bacterial or viral infection. It's definitely a situation that calls for a veterinary examination.


Harold Ronald Ford Oct 1, 1933 - Nov. 7, 2015

Then the winners and the Reserve winners go back in against each other (Junior horses show against Senior horses) , and the horse that wins is NOW called GRAND CHAMPION. ASPC/AMHR DOES NOT HAVE Grands in the Jr. or Senior classes , they will be called ONLY "Champion". if anyone has any questions please feel free to pm me . ONLY AMHA offers Jr. & Senior Grands.

Permanent Height Cards

Permanent Height Cards will only be received when your horse's papers have been Permanent with the home office. There will be an "A" or "B" after the registration number, which shows that your horse is Permanent. Once that is done, and if you have been measured after the horse's 3rd actual birthday by a steward at a sanctioned ASPC/AMHR/ASPR Show, you will receive your permanent height card in the mail from the Home Office. The Height card is mailed to the owners of the horse - not to trainer. Permanent height cards stay with the horse throughout its life and they must be validated at the first show you attend yearly and signed and dated with a height by the steward. If you sell your horse, you must give the new owner the height card.

Miniatures must be 3 years old and can be brought permanent on the horse's 3rd actual birthday.

Shetlands can be brought permanent at 6 years old and can get a Height card after the horses actual 6th birthday
